The community of Grande Prairie continued to enthusiastically embrace its public library in 2013. The number of customers coming through the door remains strong, but library usage is now also measured in other ways that reflect the habits of current society. Virtual visits to our website and catalogue grew at the phenomenal rate of 40% from 2012 to 2013, and one of the major reasons customers are visiting this virtual branch is to borrow eBooks. Usage of eBooks by our customers continues to explode, with an increase of 60% in 2013 over 2012.

The Library, however is not just about reading - it's also a thriving community space. Programs continue to be a popular and key component of our library service.

2013 saw several changes to the staff of the Library, including the departure of Deputy Director Pam Chislett, who retired after 32 years of devoted service. Pam played a significant role over the years in the growth and strengthening of the Grande Prairie Public Library and her efforts are deeply appreciated.

As the Library heads into its 75th year, we are excited about the many projects planned as part of our celebrations. I would like to acknowledge the leadership of the Board, our strong ongoing relationship with the Peace Library System and the support of municipal, regional and provincial governments, as GPPL continues to grow and respond to the needs of our vibrant community.

In 2014 we will see additional program and staffing space made available to enhance the experiences enjoyed by so many. None of this happens by chance or luck.




