3D Printers Arrive at GPPL

For immediate release May 17, 2021

The Grande Prairie Public Library has introduced a new 3D printing service. Both an Ultimaker S5 and a Flashforge Creative 3 have been purchased and will be made available to Library patrons who would like to submit a 3D file for printing.

"We're really excited to be able to offer 3D printing at GPPL," says Charlotte Anderson, Emerging Technologies Librarian. "There are so many uses, including tools and equipment, succulent planters, and Dungeons & Dragons models. We're looking forward to seeing what our patrons come up with."

Costs will be calculated by the size and complexity of the print job. "Once we receive a print file at 3d@gppl.ca, the amount of material needed will be calculated," says Anderson. "When the materials have been paid for, it will be placed in our print queue. We anticipate 3 to 4 weeks for the print job to be completed." Files are printed in a single filiment colour and can then be painted with acrylic paint.

Library patrons can utilize websites that offer 3D files such as Thingverse, MyMiniFactory, or Pinshape or build their own files with Tinkercad or Blender. "When we re-open, our Creative Computers will be available for people looking to create their own 3D modelling," says Anderson.

The 3D printers and Creative Computers were purchased with funds from the Janssen Legacy Fund. In 2016, local resident Willie Janssen made a substational bequest to the Library with the request that the funds be used to fund technology for children and teens. "Thanks to Mr. Janssen, this technology will be available to users of all ages," says Anderson.
